Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) for the Persons with Disabilities (PWDs)

Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) program for the Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) named AASTHA started in 2010 in 10 villages of Sangli and Kolhapur districts of Maharashtra. The program aimed to empower children and persons with disabilities for integrating them into all aspects of development and societal life towards an inclusive society by enabling the community to achieve inclusion of Children with Disabilities (CWDs). The project successfully completed in March 2017 entrusting the ownership to the people. At present Sangli Mission Society continues as a monitoring agency.

- 90% of special children are enrolled in schools

Prajyot Pramod Badekar (Age: 5 years)

The mother of Prajyot Pramod Badekar from Kavlapur village thought, she was dreaming when the doctors from St. John's Medical College told that her 5 year old son could walk by himself if corrective surgery could be performed on him. Her husband had deserted her with two children, blaming her for giving birth to a disabled child. Thus the entire family relied on her daily wage for survival. With a physically challenged son to be looked after, she found life very hard.

With the support of AASTHA she brought the child for the medical camp held on 8th January 2011. Doctors advised the mother to bring Prajyot to St. John's Medical College, Bangalore. After the corrective surgery Prajyot started to walk and play with his brother and friends. Today his mother is much relaxed and they started to weave many dreams around Prajyot.

Sangli Missions Society's (SMS) Department of Education is striving hard to emulate and inculcate a value based quality education to its students. Here is a brief report of its educational institutions and its manifold activities for the year 2016 - 2017. There are 10 English Medium Schools and three nurseries owned and run by SMS through which over 10,000 children prepare themselves for a joyful generation next. Our schools initiate children into regular educational system giving personal attention to every student that he or she can excel in all dimensions. Due emphasis is given for socialization, character formation, discipline and teaching. Day to day learning experience is arranged in such a way that children develop interest in coming to the school. Children are initiated into reading and writing as well as oral and written exams are conducted. To evaluate the development of children parents' - teachers' meeting is held every month.

Training for staff

Sangli Mission Society gives lots of importance to the in-service training as well as refresher courses for the teachers. Well-known resource persons are brought from established institutes. A training program was organized at Alphonsa School Miraj and in St. Thomas School, Ratnagiri in June 2016 in which teachers from all our schools participated. Mrs Anne, an educational professional from Pune was the resource person and 326 teachers attended the training.

Training of parents

The role of parents in the process of education is of paramount importance. The trust has established its own guidance and counselling centre at Ashadeep

Sangli. The centre organizes training for parents on the topic "Responsible and Smart Parenting for a Smart Education." All the schools of Sangli Mission Society conduct this workshop as per the need and specialties of the school and its locality.

Counselling and guidance

All the schools of SMS organized various counselling and career guidance sessions for students. Ashadeep Guidance and Counselling Centre conducted aptitude and IQ tests in all the high schools and helped the students to be focused on their way ahead.

Sports and extra - curricular activities

Educational Policy of SMS is very particular about the integral growth of its students. Sports and

extracurricular activities are given a lot of importance. The inter school sports and cultural competitions take place at regular intervals. Inter school competitions, athletics, cultural and literary competitions help the students of various schools of SMS to come together and interact each other for a better tomorrow. Students from every school take part in taluka, district and national level athletics, sports and games and win laurels to the schools.

Scholarships and competitive exams

All the schools of SMS encourage their students to participate in maximum number of national and international competitive examinations; to name a few, Dr. Homibhaba Exam, Brain Development, Mother India Talent Search, Maharashtra Talent Search, G. K. Olympiad, National Science Olympiad (NSO) International Mathematics Olympiad (IMO), International English Olympiad (IEO) Scholarship Exams, Spell Bee, English Marathon, etc.

Care for students with learning disabilities

All the schools of SMS are very particular about giving additional care to the students with learning disabilities like dyslexia, dysgraphia, retention disabilities, speech disabilities, etc. Remedial classes are arranged for the students with learning disabilities and are brought to the main stream.

Co-curricular activities

All the schools of SMS give lots of importance to co-curricular activities. To name a few, Science and Art Exhibitions, Cultural Fest, Science, Maths and General Quiz Competitions, Annual Gatherings, Sports and Cultural Competitions, Picnics, etc. The students present their ideas on exhibits covering a spectrum of topics. We witness large turn up of parents and local people. Also the schools bring out school magazines every year with all its scholarly charm and beauty.

Innovative teaching aids

Most of the schools are well equipped with latest teaching – learning materials like Interactive Smart Boards, labs, libraries, audio visual rooms, etc.

Socialization and care for the poor

Socialization and care for the poor is one of the important characteristics of the educational system of SMS. All the schools undertake various humanitarian activities and social action throughout the academic year so that the generation next continues their social responsibility to the society. For instance, Alphonsa School Miraj and Ichalkaranji take their students every year to Dilasa Bhavan where the HIV/AIDS infected children are given the best care.

Alphonsa Shikshan Sahayya Nidhi

Education to all is one of the basic principles of the Educational policy of SMS. Every school has

scholarship/concession systems to promote those students who are economically backward. Every school tries to identify rural children who are talented but from rural and economically backward areas. Towards this cause SMS has started generating a special fund called Alphonsa Shikshan Sahayya Nidhi which has already become unique relief to a number of poor children.

Art and science exhibitions

The budding scientists and artists of Alphonsa School Karanjoshi, Santhome School Sangli and St. Thomas School Ratnagiri organised an Art and Science Exhibition. The children could present their ideas on exhibits covering a spectrum of topics. There was a large turn up of parents and local people.

Reaching out to alumni

It is quite heart-warming that the ex-students of all the schools of SMS have great respect and level of gratitude to their schools. Even after passing out, these institutions function as energy sources for them. They take care of them through various forums like website based groups, alumni gatherings, etc.

Sangli Mission Society started working for HIV/AIDS infected and affected people in early 1990s and this program got institutionalized under the banner-DILASA by 2004. It is catering the needs of PLHIV (Persons Living with HIV/AIDS) in two ways as Institution Based Rehabilitation (IBR) and Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR).

1. DILASA BHAVAN

At present fifty-four children are staying in Dilasa Bhavan. Among them twenty nine are girls and twenty five are boys. Every year some new admissions are taking place at Dilasa Bhavan. The children enjoy in a spacious campus. They have various facilities to engage in different activities to enhance their skills and refresh their mind. It has also given special focus to control the spread of HIV/AIDS and to eradicate stigma and discrimination exists towards HIV/AIDS patients.

Hostel building for girls

A new building was built specially for the girls. This new building was blessed by Very Rev. Fr. Jose Chriampanatt – President of Sangli Mission Society and was inaugurated by Hon. Suresh Bhau Khade – MLA on 16th April 2016. There was also a colorful cultural program and meeting conducted by the children of Dilasa Bhavan. The President and the chief guest Hon. Suresh Bhau Khade highly appreciated and congratulated the Director of Dilasa Bhavan Fr. Jose Valiamangalam and the entire staff for their service and contribution for the vulnerable children.

SSC result

This year two children passed SSC Board exam in first class.

Vocational training

Two boys of Dilasa Bhavan were sent to vocational training courses conducted by Govt. of Maharashtra. They have completed the course and passed in the exams.

Picnic for children

The children were taken to Kolhapur Water Park for a picnic on 18th April, 2016. The children had a lot of fun in the park. Also the children were taken to Chatrapati Shahu Maharaj Museum, Kolhapur. It was indeed a great learning for the children and they enjoyed well.

New ambulance

It was indeed a blessing to get a new ambulance on 5th October 2016 for Dilasa Bhavan. We remember with gratitude Mr. Joy, the Managing Director of Jimcap Electronics, Verna, Goa who sponsored this new ambulance to Dilasa Bhavan. Therefore Dilasa Bhavan and Sangli Mission Society are highly indebted and always grateful to the donor.

Dental camp

Bharati Vidhyapeeth & Medical College organized a medical dental camp on the occasion of the birthday of Dr. Vishwajit Kadam, the Director of Bharati Hospital & Dental Collge, Sangli. In this event all the children of Dilasa Bhavan had dental check-up. Dental students distributed free medicines and toothpaste to children at Dilasa Bhavan.

Project for extension of dairy farm & poultry farm

A Swedish Project has been sanctioned for the extension of dairy farm & poultry farm of Dilasa Bhavan. From Sweden, the Diocese of Stockholm has granted this project. This project would be a great help to improve the dairy farm & the poultry farm.



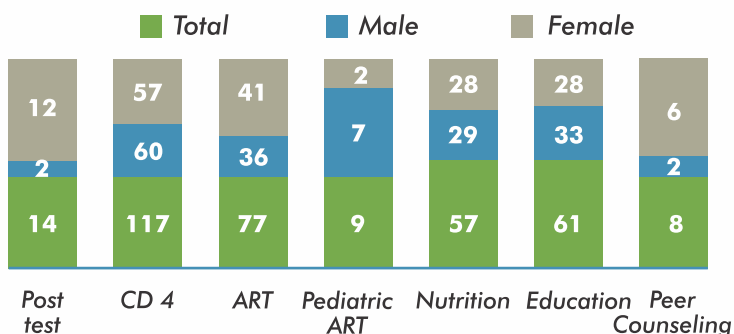
02. Dilasa Counseling and Support Center, Kolhapur

Educational support

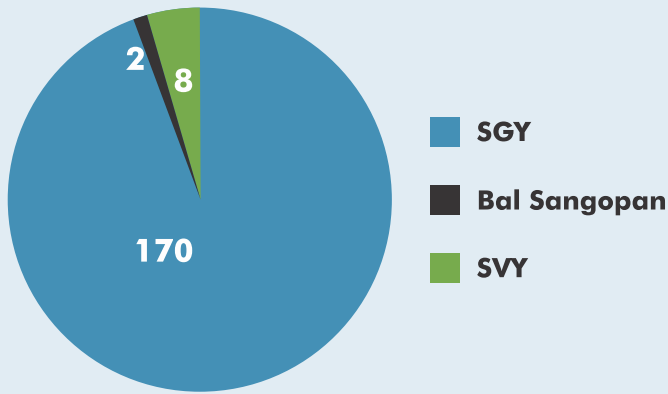

Nirmal Sadan is a hostel for girls who are in need of special care and protection. This is managed by Medical Sisters of St Joseph. Girls from poor background, HIV affected, semi orphans, etc. are admitted here. Nirmal Sadan aims at the holistic development of these children and is well appreciated by the public.



04. Care and Support Center (CSC)

Sangli Mission society is implementing four Care and Support Centers in Sangli and Kolhapur districts; namely **A. Vihaan Care and Support Center Ichalkaranji, B. Vihaan Care and Support Center Gadhinglaj, C. Vihaan Care and Support Center Miraj, D. Vihaan Care and Support Center Islampur.** The overall goal of CSC is to improve the survival and quality of life of PLHIV through early linkages of PLHIV to care, support and treatment services; improved treatment adherence and education for PLHIV; expanded positive prevention activities; improved social protection and wellbeing of PLHIV; strengthened community systems and reduced stigma and discrimination.

Services

Counseling, Support group meeting, LFU track back to ART, MIS case follow up, Pre-ART registration, CD4 follow up, Link to TI, Testing of partner/spouse, children and family member, Hospital / clinical referrals (OI management, side effects, general ailment, TB, STI treatment), Support for legal aid, Social protection and Social entitlements

Vihaan Care and Support Center, Ichalkaranji organized "Mass Yoga Demonstration" event on the occasion of National Yoga Day on 28th June 2016. 40 PLHIVs participated in yoga demonstration. Mr. Dattatray Patil from Shivaji University, Kolhapur imparted Yoga demonstration.

Educational material distribution

Educational material distribution was conducted in Vihaan Care and Support Center, Ichalkaranji on 28th June 2016. 40 poor CLHIVs benefitted with notebooks, textbooks, school bags, etc.

Vihaan Care and Support Center, Ichalkaranji organized supplementary food distribution program in December 2016 for 35 CLHIVs and Vihaan Care and Support Center Gadhinglaj organized three supplementary food distribution programs last year. **184 CLHIVs** benefitted

with supplementary food. Supplementary food kit contained groundnuts, dates, soya bean, pulses, jaggery, wheat, rice, etc. It helps CLHIVs to increase CD4 count as well as fight against Opportunistic Infections (OIs).



World T.B day celebration

Dilasa Vihaan Gadhinglaj celebrated World T.B day on 23rd March 2017 in T.B department, Sub District Hospital, Gadhinglaj and Dilasa Vihaan Ichalkaranji celebrated on 24th March 2017 in T.B department, IGM Hospital, Ichalkaranji. Dr V.S. Yadav (SMO, IGM), Dr Jitendra Hupare (HOD, T.B Dept.) along with their staff participated in the program. Both these programs were specially organized for T.B. department staff for their support and good coordination. Vihaan Care and Support Center felicitated T.B dept. staff with memento and certificate.



HIV testing camp

On 14th Sept. 2016, Vihaan CSC organized HIV testing camp with the help of Sub District Hospital Gadhinglaj and ART Center. This camp was arranged in two mandals named Gandhinagar Youth Circle, Gadhinglaj and Shivpremi Tarun Mandal, Nadives, Gadhinglaj. This camp helped 62 people to do their HIV testing. Mrs. Padmaja Gawade (ART center counselor) had given basic information on HIV/AIDS. On 6th December and on 09th March 2017, 192 people voluntarily did their HIV testing and nine people were detected HIV positive.



Social support to widows

On 18th August 2016, Vihaan CSC arranged social support and supplementary food distribution program for women and children with HIV/AIDS. It was held with local contribution from Mr. Sunil Chougule and Mrs. Kaveri Chougule (Hiranyakeshi Foundation).

30 HIV positive women were given saari and 10 CLHIV were given supplementary food. Chief guests of the program were Mrs. Sangita Rajapurkar (Sub Division Officer), Dr. Sagar Patil (DySP), Mr. Ramdas Chauhan (Tahasildar), Dr. D. S. Ambole (MS. SDH Gad.) and Dr. P. P. Patil (SMO, ARTC, SDH).

The empowerment and autonomy of women and the improvement of their social, economic, political and health status is a highly important end in itself. In addition, it is essential for the achievement of sustainable development. Saksham is a women empowerment program for the rural women with focus on Self Help Groups (SHG). Women's empowerment has five components: women's sense of self-worth; their right to have and to determine choices; their right to have access to opportunities and resources; their right to have the power to control their own lives, both within and outside the home; and their ability to influence the direction of social change to create a more just, social and economic order, nationally and internationally (Guidelines on Women's Empowerment - United Nations Population Information Network (POPIN)).

Self-Help Group (SHG) formation

SHG is a small voluntary association of people, preferably from the same socio-economic background. They come together for the purpose of solving their common problems through self-help and mutual support. It can be seen as a tool for economic empowerment for women. In the year 2016 – 17, **5805** women were brought through the ambit of **387** SHGs.

A. Childline

Childline is a 24 hour toll free phone service for the children in need of care and protection from the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD), Government of India. In 2011 Sangli Mission Society started to work as a collaborative organization for Kolhapur city.

'Case Study'

Childline Kolhapur organized Childline Se Dosti (CSD) program in Kolhapur. This program discussed the issues of parents and children. The discussion made the girls to request the CL to deliver Pallavi (name changed) from her house as she was tortured by her aunt. Childline took up the case and visited Pallavi's house. On visiting the house the CL found that all the household activities were solely done by Pallavi and not small finger was turned by her aunt in helping her. On speaking with her aunt the CL found the aunt cooperated negatively to them. Childline informed her aunt about Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and told to produce child in front of CWC. The CWC found that she too responded negatively and asked the CL to make further enquiry. The inquiring committee found that she was very severely harassed and assaulted by her aunt. Her aunt was asked to present herself before the CWC to which she responded negatively and as a result the CL informed the Shahupuri Police Station and with the help of police she was taken in to CWC. CL discussed this case with the SP office and with the help of SP, CL rescued girl from her home and was kept in Girls' Observation Home. At present she goes to school properly and she is fine over there.

'Case Study'

Vidyamandir Digvade, Panhala, Kolhapur is one of those schools surrounded by trees. As school covered with trees, mosquitoes started to generate in school premises as well as in classrooms. Usually students were interrupted by mosquitoes during the course of learning. One day, the Aflatoun Club came to discuss the issue of 'breeding mosquitoes'. At the end of discussion they came to the final point that a good health is the right of every child and brought it to the notice of head master and the teachers. Teachers told them that the mosquitoes can be controlled through Guppy Fish.

At the initial stage voluntary club members involved school students and cleaned school premises. After cleaning the school surroundings, students made small fish tank and bought one male and three female guppies for breeding. Few days later guppies started to eat mosquito's eggs and larvae, etc. Regular follow up and cleanliness was carried on towards the eradication of larvae and eggs of mosquitoes. After some time they found the result; breeding of mosquitoes got controlled. Students were very happy for what they did. Government officials, villagers and teachers appreciated Aflatoun Club members for such a big task.



Vidyamandir, Desaiwadi is a school located in Desaiwadi village of Panhala taluka of Kolhapur district. Some students of this school did not attend school after the ceasing of the holidays. This issue was taken in discussion with teachers by Aflatoun Club members. Teachers suggested that awareness can change mindset of parents as well as the society. During entire discussion one of the club members suggested to conduct an awareness rally in the village. Accordingly they conducted meeting with the respective Sarpanch of the village and other village representatives and planned the activity along with the school teachers. A rally was carried out throughout the village with the participation of Sarpanch, Grampanchayat members, social workers, school children and villagers, etc. Children used slogan,

“ चला शाळेला जाऊया आपले भविष्य घडवूया ”. Villagers appreciated them and participated in the rally. A week later number of attendance increased in each class room. Aflatoun Club members got enough appreciation from all the corners.



Vidyamandir Tirpan is situated in Panhala taluka. In this school they arranged camp on bank account opening. Accordingly representatives of Bank of India came to the school. Students of 5th, 6th and 7th classes were excited to know about banking facilities such as saving account, current account, use of ATM, how to deposit money, etc. The children clarified their queries and the bank representative explained how money is deposited in account, what is RD, FD, cheque and DD, etc. The children learnt about other services available at the bank, such as loan process, types of loans, credit card, debit card, etc. Nearly 100 students of Tirpan School opened their accounts in Bank of India, Kotoli. Parents were also happy with this initiative. All villagers appreciated this task of school.

F. Galli Galli Sim Sim To improve early grade reading through 'Play.Connect.Learn' technique

SMS run a new project namely 'Galli Galli Sim Sim' with 'Play.Connect.Learn' technique to improve early grade reading outcomes in mother tongue through community engagement. This project was done in collaboration with Sesame Workshop India. The target group of this project was rural children between 5.5 to 7.5 years of age whose families were earning less than Rs 8000/- a month but possessing an android mobile phone by anyone in the family. It aimed to help such 3750 children from Govt. Schools to enhance Marathi reading through application and games in android mobile phones. In this project we covered around 100 villages in Sangli and Kolhapur districts.



Smartphone distribution: 106 children were provided with android mobile phones as part of research to monitor how they were improving. Smartphones were distributed in Shivpuri, Kuktoli, Hingangaon, Siddhewadi, Haroli, Ghalwad villages in the presence of Sarpanch, Gram Panchayat Members, Head Master, President of Education Committee and other local representatives from the villages.
