environmental protection, implementing sustainable projects that help nurture a balanced and resilient community for a better future.

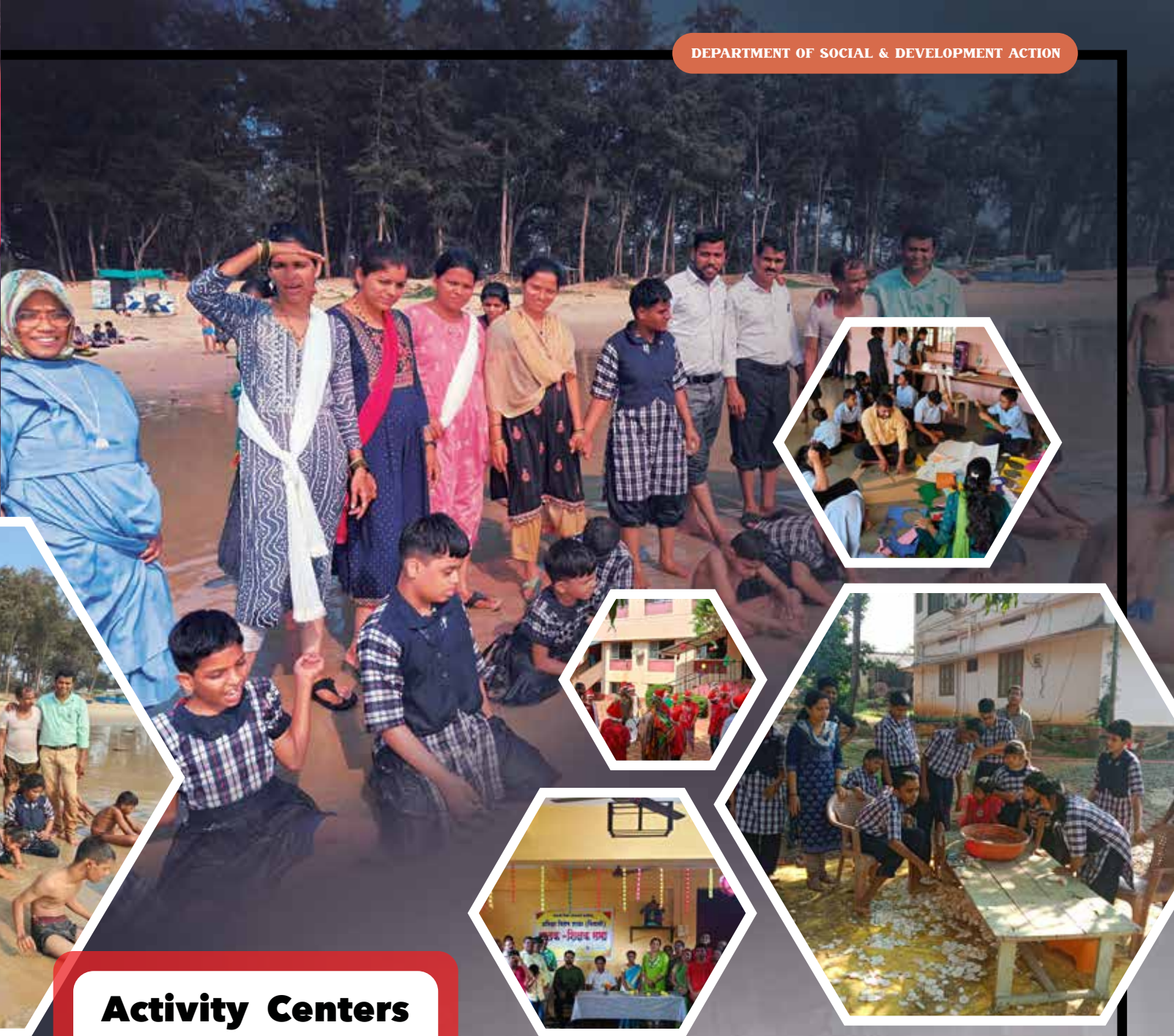

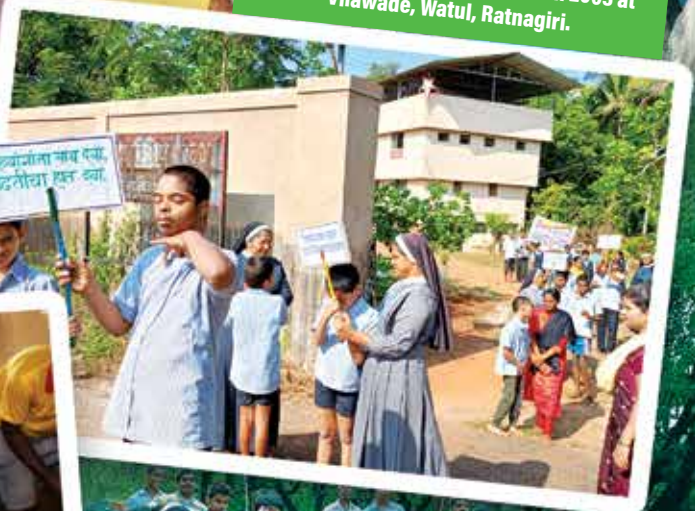

Special Education

Comprehensive and individualized educational programs are provided to meet the unique learning needs of mentally challenged students. Trained educators use innovative teaching methods and assistive tools to enhance learning and skill development.



Therapeutic Services

The centres offer physiotherapy, occupational therapy, and speech therapy to support the physical and communicative development of individuals with special needs.



Life Skills Training

Programs focus on daily living skills, including personal hygiene, cooking, and social interaction, empowering students to lead more independent lives.

Recreational Activities

Sports, cultural events, and extracurricular activities are organized to enhance physical fitness, creativity, and social engagement among students.



Vocational Training

Students are trained in practical skills such as weaving, gardening, candle-making, and craftwork to promote independence and prepare them for future employment opportunities.



Counselling and Mental Health Support

Professional counseling services are available for students and their families to address emotional, behavioral, and social challenges.

Parent Support Programs

Regular meetings and training sessions are held for parents to provide guidance, share strategies for care, and build a supportive network for families.

AASTHA SANGLI

Empowering for Integration and Inclusion

Launched on July 1, 2023, the second phase of AASTHA focuses on identifying post-pandemic challenges in rehabilitation and bridging gaps from the first phase. Using a Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR) approach, it addresses the needs of individuals with disabilities and marginalized children within their communities, fostering inclusivity, empowerment, and sustainable

development. The project prioritizes empowering children deprived of their rights and strengthening systems to uphold and safeguard these rights.

Throughout the year, the project focused on improving the lives of children with disabilities and those marginalized due to low academic performance, caste, or illness. It established children's parliaments and adolescent groups at village, block, and district levels to enhance participation and life skills. For severely disabled children and their families, the project offered programs to improve their psychosocial well-being. Activities included tuition for slow learners, awareness programs, yoga training, and counseling for parents and children from disadvantaged backgrounds. To uplift the socio-economic status of families, skill development programs and support for income-generating projects were provided. The project collaborated with duty bearers, community members, and strengthened CBOs and DPOs to promote social inclusion. It adhered to its target groups in villages across four talukas in Sangli district, Maharashtra, engaging with children, youth, families, teachers, health professionals, and other stakeholders. Although two children with disabilities passed away and three relocated, the project successfully reached a wide demographic, including scheduled caste and tribe families, pregnant women, nursing mothers, and more.





The project aims to empower children and persons with disabilities for integrating them into all aspects of development and societal life towards an inclusive society by enabling the community to achieve inclusion of children with disabilities

DILASA

A Beacon of Hope For Those Affected By HIV/AIDS

The Sangli Mission Society began its work for individuals infected and affected by HIV/AIDS in the early 1990s. This initiative took a more structured form in 2004 under the name DILASA, meaning "solace" or "comfort." Today, the program serves People and Children Living with HIV (PLHIV) through two key approaches: Dilasa Bhavan (Institution-Based Rehabilitation - IBR) and SMS Vihaan CSC (Community-Based Rehabilitation - CBR), providing comprehensive care, support, and empowerment.

DILASA BHAVAN, MIRAJ

Dilasa Bhavan operates on the model of Institution-Based Rehabilitation (IBR), providing a nurturing and secure environment for boys affected by HIV/AIDS. It serves as a residential care Centre for those who have lost one or both parents to the disease. At Dilasa Bhavan, the children receive holistic support, including education, medical care, nutritious meals, health monitoring, and safe accommodation—all provided completely free of cost. The centre ensures that these boys not only receive academic opportunities but also grow in a caring and supportive atmosphere, helping them build resilience and a brighter future. Currently, 14 boys reside at the centre, receiving dedicated care from a team of 12 compassionate staff members, who work tirelessly to meet their physical, emotional, and educational needs.

VIHAAN CARE AND SUPPORT CENTER (ICHALKRANJI & MIRAJ)

Vihaan Care and Support Centre (CSC) is a national initiative dedicated to providing comprehensive, expanded, and holistic care and support services to People Living with HIV (PLHIV). This program aims to enhance the health, well-being, and social inclusion of individuals affected by HIV/AIDS by addressing their medical, psychological, and socio-economic needs. The Sangli Mission Society plays a crucial role in implementing this initiative by managing two Vihaan Care and Support Centres, strategically located in Sangli (Miraj) and Kolhapur (Ichalkaranji) Districts. These centers act as lifelines for PLHIV, offering counseling, health services, linkage to treatment, access to social welfare schemes, and community support, ensuring that individuals receive continuous care and empowerment to lead healthier and more dignified lives.

- ☑ To improve the survival and quality of life of PLHIV through early linkages of PLHIV to care, support and treatment services.
- ☑ To improve treatment and adherence and education for PLHIVs
- ☑ To expand positive prevention activities
- ☑ To improve Social Protection and Wellbeing of PLHIV
- ☑ To strengthen the community systems and reduce stigma and discrimination towards PLHIV.

Promotion and protection of child's Rights

Sangli Mission Society runs various projects and programs for the development of the children and protection of their rights.



Childline

Since 2011 Sangli Mission Society had been incorporated as the collaborative organization in Kolhapur district for Childline project of the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MECD), Government of India. Childline is a 24-hour toll-free phone service for the children in need of care and protection. In 2019 Childline India Foundation had entrusted Sangli district child line and Kolhapur Railway Child Help Desk to Sangli Mission Society. Since 2011 Sangli Mission Society had help thousands of Children through these Childline projects. On the 31st of August 2023 Sangli Mission Society has successfully handed over these projects to the government System. The project has yet intervened more than 6463 cases, among them girls have been saved from child marriage, Children were protected from different types of abuse, Children provided emotional support and guidance, Children rescued from Child labour, children provided medical support, shelter, counselled for not getting into beggary and helped by providing different types of services.

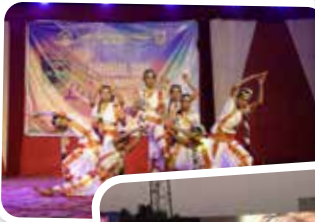

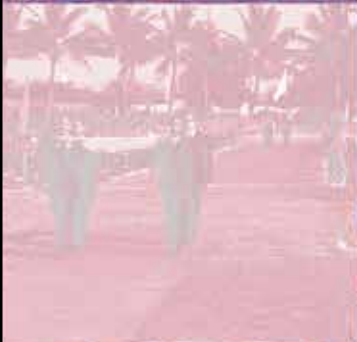
